THE senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read. Mr. Hollingsworth, from the committee, delivers to the president a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the speedy conveyance of public letters and packages, and for other purposes; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act to extend the powers of the trustees of the poor of Montgomery county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The president laid before the senate a letter from the executive of this state, enclosing a letter from the secretary of state to his excellency the governor, and an extract of a letter from Mr. King, American minister at London, to the secretary of state, dated August 10th, 1802, relative to the Maryland bank stock; which were read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act to declare the private road leading from Philip Harcastle's mills, in Caroline county, until it intersects the main road leading from Greensborough to parson Keene's, a public highway, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. At the end of the bill add, "provided that nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to charge the said county at any time hereafter with the expence of erecting or keeping in repair any bridge that may be thought necessary over Choptank river, where the said road shall cross the same, any thing in any law to the contrary notwithstanding."

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Dorchester county to permit a certain part of the road leading from the head of Church creek to the town of Cambridge, in the said county, to be changed, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. At the end of the bill add, "provided, that nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to impose any part of the charge incurred by opening, clearing and making the said road, upon the minor children, or on their mother and guardian aforesaid."

The said bills were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
