The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Nathaniel Talbot, of Caroline county, the bill, entitled, An act to repeal an act for the destruction of squirrels in Caroline county, passed November session, eighteen hundred, and the bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Worcester county to assess and levy annually a sum of money for the support of Elizabeth Cowley, daughter to Henman Cowley, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Saint-Mary's county to levy a sum of money for the rent of an office for the register of wills of said county, was read the second time and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act to alter and change the name of John Mills, of Anne, of Dorchester county, into the name of Crawford, was read the second time and will not pass.
