The bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Worcester county to open a road in said county, was read the second time and will not pass.

Mr. Johnson, from the committee, delivers to the president a bill, entitled, An act concerning the Patowmack company; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Worcester county to open a road in said county, the bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for improving the streets of Elizabeth-town, in Washington county, the bill, entitled, An act to authorise a lottery in Frederick county, the resolution in favour of Patrick Murdock, the resolution in favour of Philip Reed, and the resolution in favour of Martha Howard, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to extend the powers of the trustees of the poor of Montgomery county, endorsed; "By the house of delegates, December 22, 1802: Read the first and second time by a special order and will pass.

The bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a road from the Delaware line to intersect the Rolling road in Queen-Anne's county, was read the second time and passed with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out the words "or any three or more of them" in the 12th and 13th lines of the first page. 2. After the word "road" in the 14th line of same page insert "not exceeding."

The bill, entitled, An act for the investment of the unappropriated money in the treasury in the bank of Baltimore, was read the second time and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act to provide for the elections of representatives of this state in the congress of the United States, and of electors on the part of this state for choosing a president and vice-president of the United States, was read the second time and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a public road in Queen-Anne's county, was read the second time and will not pass.

The president laid before the senate a letter from James Ray, praying to be heard by counsel in support of his petition; which was read.

On motion, ORDERED, That the said James Ray have permission to be heard by counsel in support of his said petition.

On motion, ORDERED, That the creditors of James Ray also have permission to be heard by counsel in opposition to the petition of said James Ray.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a public road from the farm of Charles Sewell to the farm of John Chairs, junior, in Queen-Anne's county. ORDERED, That Mr. Brown, Mr. Fossitt and Mr. Whitely, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.
