

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1802.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and one, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. Strike out from the word "deed" in the 4th line from the bottom of the 1st page to the word "to" in the last line of the same page, and insert "or deeds, thereby conveying and transferring all and every part and parcel of his property, real, personal and mixed, of what nature or kind soever, to which he has any claim or title to, or interest in, either directly or indirectly, except the necessary wearing apparel of himself and family."

Mr. Whitely has leave of absence after Monday next.

Whereas by the act, entitled, An act to establish a bank, and incorporate the subscribers thereto, it is provided, that whenever this state shall become a stockholder to an amount not less than sixty-six thousand dollars, the state shall be entitled to appoint two directors of the aforesaid bank called The Bank of Baltimore, one to be chosen by the house of delegates and one by the senate: And whereas by a law passed this session, entitled, An act for the investment of the unappropriated money in the treasury in the Bank of Baltimore, this state has become a stockholder to the amount of sixty-six thousand dollars; the senate therefore proceeded to ballot for a director, on the part of this state, of the bank of Baltimore; the ballots being deposited in the ballot box, on examination thereof it appeared, that Levi Hollingsworth had a majority of votes of all the attending members.

Whereupon it is declared in the senate, that Levi Hollingsworth is duly elected by the senate, on the part of this state, a director of the Bank of Baltimore for and during the time prescribed by law.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to authorise and empower Judith C. Moale and Thomas Moale, of the city of Baltimore, to lease and demise the real estate of Richard Halton Moale, deceased, for the purposes therein mentioned, the bill, entitled, An act to empower the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, and the bill, entitled, An act relative to runaway servants and slaves, were severally read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of the securities of Dennis Griffith, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act requiring the register of wills of Baltimore county to give daily attendance at his office, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. At the end of the bill add, "under the penalty of ten dollars per day for every day's neglect, to be recovered by indictment in the court of the county, unless prevented by sufficient and unavoidable circumstances."
