the tressurer of the western shore shall advance the aforesaid sum of one thousand pounds current money, bond shall be given to the state of Maryland by at least three persons, to be approved of by the said treasurer, in the pensi sum of two thousand pounds current money, and conditioned for the payment of the said sum of one thousand pounds current money on or before the period of ten years, to be computed from the time the same shall be advanced, and for the payment of the legal interest annually thereon."
