THE committee to whom was referred the petition of Charles Arien, Antoine Minoire and Martha Villard, beg leave to report, that they have considered their case, and as the law of congress, establishing an uniform rule of naturalization, precludes the acquisition of citizenship in their instance, and the right of a fee-simple tenure in land seems properly and necessarily to attach to that situation, they are of opinion that it will be inexpedient for the legislature to interpose, and recommend that the petitioners have leave to withdraw their petition.

The bill, entitled, An act to extend the powers of the trustees of the poor of Montgomery county, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
