

4. Strike out the words "at all times hereafter" in the 2d line of the 2d page. Strike out from the word "notwithstanding" in the 10th line of the 2d page to the end of the bill.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the improvement of the streets of the city of Annapolis, and for other purposes, was read the second time and passed.

The resolution in favour of Denwood Hicks was read the second time and assented to with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. Strike out the word "five" in the 5th line and insert "four."

The resolution in favour of Elizabeth Barrow was read the second time and assented to with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out the word "five" in the 8th line and insert "four." 2. Strike out the word "five" in the last line and insert "four."

The resolution in favour of Thomas Johnson was read the second time and dissented from.

The resolution in favour of Thomas Jackson was read the second time and dissented from.

On motion, ORDERED, That the resolution respecting the Indian lands in Dorchester county be referred to Mr. Partridge, Mr. Johnson and Mr. Brown, to consider and report thereon.

The bill, entitled, An act relating to the records in the office of the register of wills in Harford county, was read the second time and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act to straighten part of the road in Harford county which leads from Underhill's mill to the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of William Henry Lansdale and Thomas Reeder Lansdale, children of Mary Lansdale, of Saint-Mary's county, was read the second time and will not pass.

The bill, entitled, An act to alter and change the names of James Clerk, and Margaret Russell his wife, of Prince-George's county, and of their children, was read the second time and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising the city commissioners to open and extend Water-street in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and passed.

The bill, entitled, An additional supplementary act to an act, entitled, An act for the relief of creditors, and to prevent frauds and deceits occasioned by secret sales, mortgages and gifts, of goods and chattels, was read the second time and will not pass.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to prevent excessive gaming, a bill, entitled, An act further supplementary to an act to straighten and amend the public roads in Harford county, a bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Calvert county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, severally passed by that house December 28, 1803; a bill, entitled, An act to revive and aid the proceedings of Calvert county court, a bill, entitled, An act authorising James Summers, late sheriff and collector of Caroline county, to complete his collection, a bill, entitled, An act relating to the inspection of flour and other articles in the city of Baltimore, a bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Baltimore county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, a bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery for raising a sum of money for the purchasing ground, and building a market-house thereon, in the western precincts of the city of Baltimore, severally passed by that house December 29, 1803; and the following resolutions:
