On the second reading of the report of the committee appointed to prepare rules for the government of the senate, the question was put, That the following be added thereto? to wit: "No member shall be permitted to vote on any question in which he is immediately and particularly interested." Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, That the senate concur with said report? Resolved in the affirmative.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, NOVEMBER 27, 1804.  
RESOLVED, That such of the securities of Robert Sinclair, late sheriff of Allegany county, as have discharged their proportion of the principal and interest on the judgments obtained against them in the general court, on or before the fifth day of November instant, shall be and they are hereby released from the payment of nine per cent. interest incurred by the non-payment of the same before the first day of November instant, according to resolution passed at last session; and such of the said securities as shall pay into the treasury their respective proportions of principal and interest on said judgments at or before the end of the present session of the general assembly, shall be and they are hereby released from the payment of the said nine per cent. incurred by a non-compliance with said resolutions passed the last session of assembly.

The president laid before the senate a letter from the executive, enclosing a letter from the treasurer of the western shore relative to the instalments on the loans for the use of the city of Washington, and also a letter from Thomas Munroe to the treasurer on the same subject; which were read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to public roads in this state, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, was read the second time by especial order and will pass.

T H U R S D A Y, November 29, 1804.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Thomas S. Fossitt, Mr. Thomas Johnson and Mr. William Thomas, appeared in the senate, and after taking the oaths required by the constitution and form of government of this state, and subscribing a declaration of their belief in the Christian religion, and taking the oath for the support of the government of the United States, took their seats.
