

The resolution in favour of Richard Watts was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Benjamin Willson, of Caroline county, a minor, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Joyce Insley, of Dorchester county, be referred to a special committee.

ORDERED, That Mr. Houston, Mr. Partridge and Mr. Fossitt, be the said committee.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Worcester county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, passed by that house November 29, 1804, and the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, DECEMBER 1, 1804.

RESOLVED, That the justices of Frederick county court, or either of them, be, and they are hereby authorised and required, upon the application of John Snider, of Frederick county, an old and disabled soldier of the late revolutionary army, to grant him from year to year, during his life, a licence to keep ordinary, and also a licence to retail spirituous liquors, &c. without his, the said John Snider, paying any thing therefor.

Which were read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The senate adjourns until Monday morning 9 o'clock.

M O N D A Y, December 3, 1804.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday, except Mr. Brown and Mr. Duckett. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The resolution in favour of John Snider, of Frederick county, was read the second time, dissented from, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Worcester county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of William Ennalls was read the second time, assented to with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. At the end of the resolution add, "provided, that nothing in this resolution shall operate to stay the proceedings against the said William Ennalls, and his securities, until judgment be obtained and in case the debt shall not be paid at the time above mentioned, the judgments shall be in force, and executions may issue thereon without being renewed by a writ or writs of scire facias."

Mr. Houston, from the committee, delivers the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Joyce Insley, of Dorchester county; which was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out from the word "estate" in the 8th line of the 1st page to the word "and" in the 10th line of the same page. 2. Strike out from the word "that" in the 12th line of the 1st page to the word "to" in the 13th line of the same page and insert the word "right." 3. After the word "shall" in the 14th line of the same page insert "may be relinquished to, and vested in, her." 4. Strike out from the word "that" in the 1st line of the 2d page to the word "hath" in the 3d line same page and insert "the justices of the levy court of Dorchester county shall be and they are hereby authorised and requested to relinquish and release to the said Joyce Insley all the right, title, interest, estate and claim, which the said county has in and to the said Joyce Insley." 5. Strike out from the word "Insley" in the 5th line of the 2d page to the word "any" in the 7th line of the same page.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to establish a bank, and incorporate a company, under the name of The Farmers Bank of Maryland, and for other purposes, passed by that house November 30, 1804; a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act authorising the city commissioners to open and extend Water-street in the city of Baltimore, passed by that house December 1, 1804; a bill, entitled, An act to prevent the running at large of swine in the town of New Winsor, in Frederick county, passed by that house December 3, 1804; and the following resolutions:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, DECEMBER 3, 1804.

RESOLVED, That all proceedings against John Dames, Richard Hall, John Chairs and James Clayland, jun. of Queen-Anne's county, on a judgment obtained against them in the general court for the eastern shore of Maryland at September term, eighteen hundred and four, as securities for Henry Costin, late sheriff of said county, for a balance due to the state of Maryland, be and are hereby suspended until the first day of May, eighteen hundred and six; and that they the said John Dames, Richard Hall, John Chairs and James Clayland, jun. be and they are hereby released from the payment of nine per cent. per annum of the fifteen per cent. interest chargeable on the principal of the balance due to the state, on condition only that the said John Dames, Richard Hall, John Chairs and James Clayland, jun. shall punctually pay to the treasurer of the eastern shore, on or before the first day of May, eighteen hundred and six, the principal of the balance due to the state.
