We hope you will reconsider the bill, and recede from this part of the said amendment.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the sale of certain land belonging to the estate of Stephen Wilson, late of the city of Baltimore, deceased, passed by that house December 31, 1804, and the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, DECEMBER 31, 1804.

RESOLVED, That no payment of interest on the loan of one thousand pounds made by the state of Maryland to the president and trustees of Charlotte-Hall school, at November session, one thousand eight hundred and two, shall be required until the first day of January; eighteen hundred and eight, but that the same shall and may remain in the hands of the said president and trustees, to be disposed of as they may think best for the use of the said school; provided nevertheless, that the interest arising on the loan aforesaid, till the said period, shall be thereafter paid at the rate of one third part of the same then due, annually, till the whole shall be discharged.

The bill, entitled, An act to prevent the erection of booths within one mile of any methodist meeting-house in Talbot county during quarterly meeting, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out the words "and after publication hereof" and insert "of this act." 2. After the word "booth" in the 8th line insert "for the purpose of selling." 3. After the word "or" in the same line insert "shall." 4. After the word "any" in the 3d line of the 1st enacting clause insert "spirituous." 5. Strike out from the word "or" in the same line to the word "within." 6. After the word "house" in the next line insert "in Talbot county." 7. After the word "keeper" in the last line of the bill insert "or licensed retailer." 8. At the end of the bill add "or stores."

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Joseph Booth, of Saint-Mary's county, the bill, entitled, An act to lay out and make public several roads in Queen-Anne's county, the bill, entitled, An act authorising the selling and disposing of a small parcel of land belonging to Stepney parish, in Somerset county, the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road to lead from the cross roads near Richard Catton's limekiln, in Baltimore county, nearly in the direction of Jones's Falls, to the city of Baltimore, the resolution in favour of Isaac Williams, of Dorchester county, the resolution in favour of John C. Bond, late sheriff of Harford county, and the letter from the governor with the letter from Mr. William Pinkney, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the regulation of Denton, in Caroline county, and for other purposes therein mentioned, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out "three fourths" in the 3d line of the 2d enacting clause and insert "one quarter." 2. Strike out "three fourths" in the last line of the 1st page and insert "one quarter." 3. Strike out "three fourths" in the 6th line 2d page and insert "one quarter."
