The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

### T H U R S D A Y, November 14, 1805.

**T**HE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act passed at November session, eighteen hundred and four, entitled, An act to provide for the trial of facts in the several counties of this state, and to alter, change and abolish, all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the general court and court of appeals. **ORDERED**, That Mr. Houston, Mr. Christie, Mr. Brown, Mr. Hayward and Mr. Thomas, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act granting leave to the trustees of Bethel congregation, in Harford county, to receive a deed for, and hold, the land therein mentioned, passed by that house November 14, 1805; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

### F R I D A Y, November 15, 1805.

**T**HE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

### S A T U R D A Y, November 16, 1805.

**T**HE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Partridge appeared in the senate.

The bill, entitled, An act granting leave to the trustees of Bethel congregation, in Harford county, to receive a deed for, and hold, the land therein mentioned, was read the second time and will pass.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Thomas Webb, of Montgomery county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The senate adjourns until Monday morning 9 o'clock.

### M O N D A Y, November 18, 1805.

**T**HE senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read. The bill, entitled, An act granting leave to the trustees of Bethel congregation, in Harford county, to receive a deed for, and hold, the land therein mentioned, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

A petition from Daniel Hollingsworth, of Queen-Anne's county, praying that a law may pass authorising the justices of Queen-Anne's county court to appoint a guardian for David Ford, of said county, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Brown, Mr. Houston and Mr. Hayward, to consider and report thereon.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

### T U E S D A Y, November 19, 1805.

**T**HE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act authorising Lawrence Brengle, late collector of Frederick county, to complete his collection, passed by that house November 18, 1805; a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Benjamin Gushwa, Martin Rickart and John Manning, of Washington county, passed by that house November 19, 1805; and the following resolution:

By THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, November 18, 1805.

**RESOLVED**, That all proceedings against William Gardiner, and others, for the recovery of the balance due by them to the state of Maryland, be and they are hereby suspended until after the first day of December; eighteen hundred and six, and that the said William Gardiner be and he is hereby indulged in the payment of the balance till the period before mentioned; provided, that the judgment aforesaid shall continue and be in full force, notwithstanding the suspension of proceedings directed by this resolution, and if the balance that will then be due on the aforesaid judgment be not paid by the time aforesaid, an execution may again be issued against the said William Gardiner to enforce the payment thereof.
