W E D N E S D A Y, November 20, 1805.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Houston, from the committee, delivers to the president a bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled, An act to provide for the trial of facts in the several counties of this state, and to alter, change and abolish, all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the general court and court of appeals; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, ORDERED, That the said bill have a second reading on Friday the twenty-second instant. The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Thomas Webb, of Montgomery county, was read the second time and will pass.

Mr. Stephen and Mr. Hebb are appointed by the house of delegates to join the gentlemen appointed by you in the examination of the ballots; and to regulate the manner of said election we have adopted the following resolution:

RESOLVED, That the two directors to be appointed on the part of this state in the Union Bank of Maryland, be elected by ballot, and the two persons having a majority of the ballots be declared duly elected directors on the part of this state in the Union Bank of Maryland.

BY THE SENATE, November 21, 1805.

GENTLEMEN OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES,

WE agree to proceed immediately to the election of two directors on the part of this state in the Union Bank of Maryland. No person is put in nomination by the senate in addition to those mentioned in your message. Mr. Thomas and Mr. Partridge will join the gentlemen named by your house in the examination of the ballots. We have adopted the resolution sent with your message, with the following amendment: In the fifth line of the resolution, after the word "ballots," insert "of all the attending members of both houses of the legislature."
