On motion, ORDERED, That the bill, entitled, An act to organize the courts of common law of this state and relative to the records and other proceedings in the late court of appeals and general court, have a second reading on Wednesday next the eighteenth day of December.

The bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a road in Hartford county, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. After the word "from" in the 9th line of the 1st page insert "the." 2. After the word "road" in the 12th line of the 2d page insert "which plot and certificate so confirmed." 3. Strike out from the word "necessary" in the 3d line from the bottom of the 2d page to the word "and" and insert "for surveying and opening the said road."

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to continue the act therein mentioned, a bill, entitled, An act to authorize and empower the levy court of Baltimore county to assess and levy a rate of money for the purpose therein mentioned, severally passed by that house December 13, 1805; and the following resolutions:
