Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out the words "place of religious worship," in the sixth line from the bottom of the 1st page and insert "meeting-house." 2. Strike out from the word "methodists" in the same line to the word "the" in the next line, and insert "during the time." 3. Strike out the words "Queen-Anne's" in the last line but one in the same page. 4. Strike out the word "Caroline" in the same line. 5. After the word "Kent" in the same line insert "Cæcil." 6. Strike out from the word "Harford" in the last line of the same page to the word "shall" in the 2d line of the next page. 7. Strike out the words "Be it enacted" in the first line of the last enacting clause and insert "provided." 8. At the end of the bill add, "or from the erection of booths, and selling of spirituous liquors, during the time of public races, any thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding."

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a road from the Pennsylvania line to the Susquehanna canal, in Cæcil county, and a bill, entitled, An act for an addition to the town of Rockville, in Montgomery county, severally passed by that house December 30, 1805; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to extend the powers of the levy court of Allegany county relative to roads in said county, be referred to a special committee. ORDERED, That Mr. Houston, Mr. Brown and Mr. J. Johnson, be the said committee.

The resolution in favour of Joseph Mills was read the second time and assented to. The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Anne Reynolds, of Talbot county, was read the second time and will pass.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to establish permanent salaries for the judges of the six judicial districts in this state, a bill, entitled, An act to alter the time of meeting of the general assembly of this state, and for other purposes, severally passed by that house December 31, 1805; a bill, entitled, An act to alter and change the name of Elizabeth Sower, of the city of Baltimore, to that of Elizabeth Lammott, a bill, entitled, An act to withdraw the funds from Washington and Saint-John's colleges, and subject the same to the appropriation of the legislature, a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Thomas Hodges, and Eleanor Hodges, the infant children of James Hodges, late of Prince-George's county, deceased, severally passed by that house January 1, 1806; a bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Baltimore county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, and a bill, entitled, An act for the support of Solomon Jones and wife, severally passed by that house January 2, 1806; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act to appoint Elizabeth Crabb and Richard Orme, of Montgomery county, trustees for locating and transferring certain lands lying in Montgomery county, part of the real estate of the late Jeremiah Crabo, deceased, was read the second time and will not pass.
