THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road to lead from the cross roads near Richard Caton's limekiln, in Baltimore county, nearly in the direction of Jones's Falls, to the city of Baltimore, the bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a road from the Pennsylvania line to the Susquehanna canal, in Cecil county, the bill, entitled, An act for an addition to Rockville, in Montgomery county, the letter from the executive, with its enclosures, and the message from the senate, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Richard Gittings and Lambert Smith, of Baltimore county, insolvent debtors, and a bill, entitled, An act to declare what shall be evidence in certain cases therein mentioned, severally passed by that house January 2, 1806; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill, entitled, An act to withdraw the funds from Washington and St. John's colleges, and subject the same to the appropriation of the legislature, have a second reading on Tuesday next the seventh of January.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill, entitled, An act to establish permanent salaries for the judges of the six judicial districts in this state, have a second reading on Wednesday next the eighth of January.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Baltimore county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act for marking and bounding lands, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out the words "or adjoining" in the fourth line of the enacting clause.

2. After the word "city" in the same line insert "and precincts."

The bill, entitled, An act for the support of Solomon Jones and wife, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of James M. Crasap, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the bill, entitled, An act giving further powers to the corporation of the city of Baltimore, passed by that house January 4, 1806; ordered that said bill be engrossed.
