The bill, entitled, An act to ratify and confirm the marriage articles made between Ely Dorsey, of Ely, of Frederick county, and Araminta his wife, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for draining part of a branch of Tuckahoe, known by the name of Beaver Dam Branch, lying in Queen-Anne's county, and the bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to lay out and establish a road from the city of Annapolis to the city of Washington, and to repeal the act therein mentioned, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to amend and make conveniently passable, the public road leading from the lands of Mrs. Dennison to the upper ferry in the town of Havre-de-Grace, a bill, entitled, An act to establish a chancery tribunal on the eastern shore of this state, and to alter and abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state as are repugnant thereto, a bill, entitled, An act to lay out and make a public road from William Pyles's saw mill on Deer creek, in Harford county, a bill, entitled, An act to change the place of holding elections in the fourth election district of Montgomery county, and a bill, entitled, An act for draining part of a branch called Old-town Branch, lying in the upper part of Caroline county, severally passed by that house January 11, 1806; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to streighten part of the road in Harford county which leads from Underhill's mill to the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Charles Thomas Clarke and William Hall, devisees of Benjamin Hall, late of Prince-George's county, deceased, and the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Thomas Hodges and Eleanor Hodges, the infant children of James Hodges, late of Prince-George's county, deceased, were severally read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to negroes, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to empower the justices of the levy court of St. Mary's county to assess and levy annually a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to extend the powers of the trustees of the poor of Montgomery county, and the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the establishment of a new public road in Somerset county, passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety-eight, were severally read the second time and will pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising the trustees of the poor of Prince-George's county to make an exchange of part of the lands belonging to said poor-house, was read the second time and will pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill, entitled, An act to prevent free negroes from selling any corn, wheat, tobacco or other articles, without having a licence for that purpose from a justice of the peace, be referred to a special committee. ORDERED, That Mr. Thomas, Mr. Christie and Mr. Houston, be the said committee.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise Baltimore county court to remove the case therein mentioned, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise James Rice and Mary Wolf to dispose of the land therein mentioned, was read the second time and will pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to appoint Elizabeth Crabb and Richard Orme, of Montgomery county, trustees for locating and transferring certain lands lying in Montgomery county, part of the real estate of the late Jeremiah Crabb, deceased, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
