

The following message was read, agreed to, and sent the house of delegates by the clerk.

By THE SENATE, January 15, 1806.

GENTLEMEN OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES,

WE have dissented from the resolution passed your house in favour of Jesse Jarrett, of Harford county. In dissenting from this resolution the senate are not to be understood expressing an opinion on the propriety of the claim, but because they consider the subject more proper for the decision of the chancellor, who can examine as to the existence of the alleged facts and the equity of the claim. If your house will originate a resolution referring the claim to the determination of the chancellor, it will meet with the assent of the senate.

On motion, the question was put, Will the senate reconsider the bill, entitled, An act to establish permanent salaries for the judges of the six judicial districts in this state? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill being read, the question was put, Shall this bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative; and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of Jacob Workman was read the second time and assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. McCulloch, from the committee, delivers a bill, entitled, An act relating to the inspection of tobacco not the growth of this state; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The resolution in favour of Robert Haikerstone was read the second time, dissented from, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act for erecting a town at or near the mouth of Will's creek, in Allegany county, a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and three, and a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the erection of a new court-house for Baltimore county, severally passed by that house January 14, 1806; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act authorising the late collectors of public taxes in Cecil county to complete their several collections, a bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Anne Arundel county to assess a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, severally passed by that house January 15, 1806; and the following message:

GENTLEMEN OF THE SENATE,

THE office of register of wills of Saint-Mary's county having become vacant by the death of Jeremiah Jordan, Esquire, we propose, with the concurrence of your house, to proceed to the election of a person to supply said vacancy immediately. Mr. James Forrest and Mr. Edmund Key are put in nomination by this house to fill this office, and Mr. Plater and Mr. Stephen are appointed by us to join such gentlemen as you may appoint to count the ballots.

Which were severally read the first time and the bills ordered to lie on the table.

The following message was read, agreed to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

By THE SENATE, January 15, 1806.

GENTLEMEN OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES,

WE agree to proceed immediately to ballot for a person to be recommended as register of wills for Saint-Mary's county, as proposed in your message of this day. No person is put in nomination by the senate in addition to the gentlemen nominated by your house. Mr. Thomas and Mr. T. Johnson are appointed to join the gentlemen named by you in counting the ballots.

The senate proceeded to ballot for a person to be recommended to the governor to be commissioned as register of wills for St. Mary's county; the ballots being deposited in the ballot box, the gentlemen named to strike retired, and after sometime returned and reported, that Mr. Edmund Key was elected.

Whereupon it is declared in the senate, that Edmund Key, having been duly elected, be recommended to the governor to be commissioned as register of wills for Saint-Mary's county.

The bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. At the end of the bill add, "And, whereas by an act passed at the present session of assembly it is provided, that an election shall be held for managers of the Baltimore and Reister's-town turnpike company on the first Monday in April next, and as the election being held on so late a day may much impede the operations of the company; therefore, Be it enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to hold the election of managers of the Baltimore and Reister's-town turnpike company on the third Monday in February next, any thing in the aforesaid act to the contrary notwithstanding."

The bill, entitled, An act to declare what shall be evidence in certain cases therein mentioned, was read the second time and will not pass.
