

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the bill, entitled, An act to establish a bank at Elizabeth-town, Washington county, by the name of The Western Bank of Maryland, rejected by that house January 27, 1806. T U E S D A Y, January 28, 1806.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The clerk of the council delivers a letter from the executive, covering certain resolutions of the state of Georgia, relative to an amendment proposed by the state of North-Carolina to the constitution of the United States; which were read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following message:

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, January 28, 1806:

GENTLEMEN OF THE SENATE,

WE have received your message, relative to the going into a new ballot for a register of wills for Saint-Mary's county, on account of a mistake in balloting; we propose going into the ballot immediately; there is no other person put in nomination than those whose names were mentioned in the former message.

The senate proceeded again to ballot for a person to be recommended to the governor to be commissioned as register of wills for St. Mary's county; the ballots being deposited in the ballot box, the gentlemen named to strike retired, and after examination thereof returned and reported, that James Forrest was elected.

Whereupon it is declared in the senate, that James Forrest, having been duly elected, be recommended to the governor to be commissioned as register of wills for St. Mary's county.

The resolutions relative to Washington and St. John's colleges were read the second time by especial order, and the question put, Will the senate assent thereto? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following resolution:

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, January 28, 1806.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Thomas Bayly, Esquire, one of the delegates from Somerset county, or to his order, seven dollars, for two days allowance, and to John Cottman, Esquire, a delegate from the same county, twenty-one dollars, for six days attendance, which sums have been omitted to be allowed them on the journal of accounts.
