

TUESDAY, December 23, 1806.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to public roads in this state, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned; a bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a road in Washington county, severally passed by that house December 22, 1806; and the following resolution:

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, December 22, 1806.
RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to George Fitzhugh, of Baltimore county, or his order, the sum of three hundred dollars, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury. All which is submitted.

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of the representatives of George Sharky, of Washington county, was read the second time by especial order and will pass.

WEDNESDAY, December 24, 1806.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

A petition from the Falls turnpike road company was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Partridge, Mr. Gibson and Mr. Dorsey, to consider and report thereon.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to compel the vestry of Shrewsbury parish, in Kent county, to fulfil the contracts and engagements of the former vestry, a bill, entitled, An act to compel justices of the peace to return all recognizances taken before them, a bill, entitled, An act to stop up, enclose and improve, a ten foot alley in the city of Baltimore, a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the congregation of Salem's church, in Washington county, a bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the commissioners of the city of Baltimore to alter and extend the streets therein mentioned, a bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to lay out and make a public road from the black house, in Harford county, to the Pennsylvania line, severally passed by that house December 23, 1806; a bill, entitled, An act to alter the time of holding the county court in Worcester county, a bill, entitled, An act to enlarge the power of the trustees of the poor of Montgomery county, severally passed by that house December 24, 1806; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The president laid before the senate an account of taxes on proceedings in chancery, received by Samuel H. Howard, from the twelfth day of December, eighteen hundred and five, to the twelfth day of December, eighteen hundred and six, and by him paid over to the treasurer of the western shore; which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, RESOLVED, That Edward Reynolds be heard by counsel at the bar of the senate in support of his petition.

The counsel for the petitioner having been heard, on the second reading of the resolution in favour of the said Edward Reynolds, the question was put, Will the senate assent thereto? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, An act to enable the trustees of the Roman catholic church in the city of Baltimore to purchase a piece of ground therein mentioned, was read the second time and will pass.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Thomas Hodges and Eleanor Hodges, the infant children of James Hodges, late of Prince-George's county, deceased, was read the second time and will not pass.

The bill, entitled, An act to alter, change and amend, a road in Anne-Arundel county, was read the second time and will pass.
