SATURDAY, December 27, 1806.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Glenn and Mr. M'Elderry. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to purchase a fire engine, and to purchase ground and to build a school-house, in Rockville, in Montgomery county, a bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act for the more effectual collection of the county charges in Allegany county, a bill, entitled, An act to lay out, open and improve, the road leading from Hancock, in Washington, to Cumberland, in Allegany county, a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to appoint a wreckmaster for Worcester county, a bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of William Booth and Jane Booth, severally passed by that house December 26, 1806; a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Elizabeth Webster, of the city of Baltimore, passed by that house December 27, 1806; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act to continue certain acts of assembly, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Cambridge, in Dorchester county, and to establish and regulate a market in said town, a bill, entitled, An act to restrain the evil practices arising from free negroes keeping dogs, and to prohibit them from carrying guns or offensive weapons, severally passed by that house December 27, 1806; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open an old road in Harford county, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to compel justices of the peace to return all recognizances taken before them, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The senate adjourns until Monday morning 9 o'clock.

MONDAY, December 29, 1806.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The president laid before the senate a letter from the honourable Samuel Smith, relative to the road contemplated by congress from Cumberland to the Ohio; which was read.

The bill, entitled, An act to prohibit the emigration of free negroes into this state, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to prevent persons from retailing spirituous liquors within a certain distance of any place of religious worship, except as is therein excepted, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to appoint a wreckmaster for Worcester county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act relating to orphans, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The president laid before the senate a letter from the governor, covering a copy of the act of congress for laying out a road from Fort Cumberland to the Ohio, the report of the commissioners appointed to lay out said road, and a letter from the president of the United States, relative thereto; also a letter from Samuel Smith, one of the representatives of this state in the senate of the United States, relative to the bridge contemplated to be built across the Patowmack river; which were read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act to compel the vestry of Shrewsbury parish, in Kent county, to fulfil the contracts and engagements of the former vestry, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to purchase a fire engine, and to purchase ground and to build a school-house, in Rockville, in Montgomery county, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
