

The bill, entitled, An act supplementary to the act for erecting a town in Talbot county, and to the act for the regulation and improvement of Easton, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk; and the resolutions in favour of Joseph H. Nicholson, Esquire, were read the second time, assented to with the proposed amendment; and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. Strike out the word "aforesaid" in the 5th line of the last resolution.

The bill, entitled, An act to lay out, open and clear, a certain road in Somerset county, was read the second time by especial order, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. After the word "Somerset" in the 4th line of the 1st page, insert "county."

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to reduce into one the several acts of assembly respecting elections, and to regulate said elections, was read the second time by especial order and will not pass.

The resolution in favour of James Laurence was read the second time, dissented from; and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act for erecting buildings for the use of the poor in Queen Anne's county, and for other purposes, was read the second time by especial order, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. Strike out the word "two" in the 9th line of the 1st page and insert "three."

The resolutions in favour of Philip B. Key, were read the second time by especial order, assented to with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. After the word "Maryland" in the last line but one of the second resolution, insert "so as aforesaid acquired."

The bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act for the more effectual collection of the county charges in Allegany county, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. After the word "shore" in the 9th line of the 1st page insert "in the spring or summer months." 2. After the word "think" in the same line insert "properly."

3. After the word "county" in the 5th line from the bottom of the 2d page insert, "And be it enacted, That nothing in this act shall affect any tract or tracts of land, lot or lots, granted to the officers and soldiers of this state, unless the same shall have been, or may hereafter be, sold or transferred by said officers and soldiers; and provided, that nothing herein contained shall affect the rights of persons under the impediment of infancy, coverture, insanity of mind, or actual imprisonment, or of citizens of the United States beyond the seas, until twelve months after the removal of such disabilities."

The bill, entitled, An act authorising the commissioners of Charles-town, in Cecil county, to purchase a lot of ground for the purpose therein mentioned, was read the second time by especial order, passed with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out the word "further" in the 2d line from the bottom of the 1st page. 2. Strike out the word "further" in the 3d line of the 2d page.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to encourage the destruction of crows in the several counties of this state, passed by that house December 30, 1806; a bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Baltimore county to levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, passed by that house December 29, 1806; and the following resolution:

By the HOUSE OF DELEGATES, December 29, 1806.  
RESOLVED, That all proceedings against Joseph Ennalls, and his securities, and all proceedings against William Ennalls's securities, and likewise against the representatives and securities of Eliza Hodson, deceased, and their bonds to the state of Maryland, for the purchase money due this state for the sale of the Indian lands, be and the same are hereby suspended and stayed until the first day of December, eighteen hundred and eight.
