Amendment proposed: Strike out the last enacting clause.
The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to prevent any obstruction of the navigation in the river Patowmack, a bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a public road in the direction herein after mentioned in Baltimore county, a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of the sheriffs of the several counties of this state, a bill, entitled, An act annulsing the marriage of Sally Lutig and John C. Lutig, severally passed by that house December 31, 1806; the following resolutions were adopted:

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, December 31, 1806.
RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to the order of the governor the sum of two thousand dollars, one thousand of which shall be applied to the repairs of the government property, and one thousand dollars in the purchase of such furniture as he may deem necessary.

RESOLVED, That the governor be required to lay before the next general assembly an account of the manner in which the said money shall have been applied.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to the examiner-general of the western shore such sum, in addition to his fees for the present year, as shall amount to the sum of three hundred pounds current money, and the examiner-general shall lay before the next session of assembly the amount of fees by him received in this year, on oath.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay unto Jubb Foyle, messenger to the executive, in addition to his present salary, the sum of one hundred dollars annually, in quarterly payments, during his continuance in office.

RESOLVED, By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, December 31, 1806.
Gentlemen of the Senate, we desire you to consider this in your convenience, according to your pleasure.
WE propose to proceed immediately to the election of two directors on the part of this state in the Farmers Bank of Maryland. William Kilty, William Hayward and John Chalmers, are put in nomination by this house. Mr. Brück and Mr. Bishop are appointed by the house of delegates to join the gentlemen to be appointed by you in the examination of the ballots, and to regulate the manner of said election we have adopted the following resolution:

RESOLVED, That the two directors to be appointed on the part of this state in the Farmers Bank of Maryland, be elected by ballot, one of whom shall be a resident of the city of Annapolis or of Anne Arundel county, upon the western shore, and the other a resident of the town of Easton in Talbot county, upon the eastern shore; and that the person resident on the western shore as aforesaid, having a majority of ballots of all the attending members of both branches of the legislature, shall be a director of the Farmers Bank of Maryland, and the person resident on the eastern shore, having the majority of ballots of all the attending members of both branches of the legislature, shall be a director of the Branch Bank of said Farmers Bank of Maryland; and the persons having a majority of ballots as aforesaid, shall be declared duly elected as aforesaid.

Which said bills, resolutions and messages, were severally read the first time, and the bills, and resolutions ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act annulsing the marriage of Benjamin Ferguson and Ruth his wife, of Cecil county, a bill, entitled, An act relating to public roads in Queen-Anne's county; severally passed by that house December 31, 1806; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the engrossed bills from No. 1 to 30, inclusive, severally assented to by that house December 31, 1806; which were read and assented to, and the bills, and resolutions, and the bill, entitled, An act to open a road from the Bald Friar ferry, on Susquehanna river, to the Pennsylvania line, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed: After the word "county" in the 1st line of the 2d page insert "if they should be of opinion that the said road will be of public benefit or utility."

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to authorise a lottery or lotteries to raise a sum of money for the improvement of the navigation of the river Susquehanna, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
