The resolutions relative to the land-office were read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The engrossed bills from 31 to 61, inclusive, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The journal of accounts was read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the payment of the journal of accounts, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
