

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1807. 9

An act to alter, change and repeal, such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state as relate to the division of Saint-Mary's county into electoral districts, passed by that house November 18, 1807; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the benefit of Robert Williams, a free black man, and of his wife and children, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to alter the time of holding the county courts of Queen-Anne's county, passed by that house November 18, 1807; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act for the support of Elias Thompson and Mary Thompson, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. 1. After the word "on" in the 11th line of the bill insert "the assessable property of." 2. At the end of the bill add "and the money, when collected, shall be paid by the collector of said county to Sarah Thompson, or order, for the uses aforesaid."

The president laid before the senate a letter from Richard Potts, presiding visitor of Frederick county school, containing an account of all sums of money received by the visitors, and also a statement shewing the number of scholars in the several departments of said school; which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act for the support of Elias Thompson and Mary Thompson, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The president laid before the senate a report of the president and trustees of Charlotte Hall school; which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act to establish a bank, and incorporate a company, under the name of The Farmers Bank of Maryland, and for other purposes, passed by that house November 20, 1807; a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of John Troxal, of Frederick county, passed by that house November 21, 1807; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of John Dilworth, of Frederick county, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
