

## VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1807. 111

The bill, entitled, An act directing the register of wills for Baltimore county to deliver over to the persons therein named the last will and testament of Robert Burney, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of John Trueman was read the second time, dissented from, and, with the following message, sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

By the S E N A T E, November 23, 1807.

*Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,*

WE have dissented from your resolution in favour of John Trueman. If your house will originate a resolution, giving to him the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, and the like sum to the widow of Edward Roberts, late messenger of the senate, to be applied by her to the support and maintenance of herself and family, it will meet our concurrence. It is represented to us, that the said Edward Roberts was a brave and most meritorious soldier during the revolutionary war. The members of the senate, acquainted with his services as their late officer, bear ample testimony to his attentive and faithful discharge of his duties as their messenger, and his family are left in a very indigent and destitute situation.

The bill, entitled, An act to lay out and make a public road in Baltimore county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to alter the time of holding the county courts of Queen-Anne's county, the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to the public roads in the several counties therein mentioned, and the bill, entitled, An act for the relief and benefit of the poor, and trustees of the poor, of Washington county, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of building a bridge across the river Monocacy, in Frederick county, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out the word "and" in the 4th line from the bottom of the 1st page. 2. After the word "Philips" in the same line of the same page insert "and Frederick Eichelberger." 3. Strike out the word "and" in the 3d line of the 2d page. 4. After the word "Philips" in the same line of the same page insert "and Frederick Eichelberger." 5. After the word "commissioners" in the 4th line from the bottom of the 2d page insert "or a majority of them."

The bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of finishing the steeple of Saint-John's church in Elizabeth-town, in Washington county, and for other purposes, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. After the word "commissioners" in the 1st line of the last enacting clause insert "or a majority of them."
