

THURSDAY, December 10, 1807.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Glenn and Mr. Someryell appeared in the senate.

On motion, the question was put, Will the senate reconsider the bill, entitled, An act for quieting possessions and securing and confirming the estates of purchasers? Resolved in the affirmative.

On progression in reading said bill, the question was put, Will the senate receive the following as an amendment? to wit: After the word "husband" in the 5th line of the 4th page insert "or privately and willingly, out of the hearing of the husband, or words to that effect." Resolved in the affirmative, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the amendment of the law, the resolution in favour of John Lynch, the resolution in favour of Monica Greenwell, and the message relative thereto, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to enlarge the powers of the trustees of the poor of Montgomery county, passed by that house December 9, 1807; and the following resolution:

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, December 10, 1807.
RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Evan Willing, the sum of one hundred pounds, for a negro slave who was drowned in consequence of his being pursued as a runaway. All which is submitted.

FRIDAY, December 11, 1807.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Glenn, who is indisposed. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution in favour of Elisha Hopkins was read the second time and assented to.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act authorising the collection of certain ground-rents due on lots in the town of Cumberland; a bill, entitled, An act to lay out and make a public road in Anne-Arundel county, severally passed by that house December 11, 1807; and the following resolution:

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, December 11, 1807.
RESOLVED, That all proceedings against Thomas Jackson, and his securities, on judgments obtained by this state against them for the purchase money due this state on the fourth and last instalment of the Choptank Indian lands, be and the same are hereby suspended and stayed until the first of January, eighteen hundred and ten.

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
Mr. Lowrey, from the committee, delivers a bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act relating to the public roads in Queen-Anne's county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising Alexis Boone, late sheriff of Prince-George's county, to complete his collection, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. Strike out from the word "the" in the 15th line of the 1st page to the word "eighteen" in the 16th line of the same page, and insert "year."

The resolution in favour of John Barnes, clerk to Charles county court, was read the second time and assented to.

On motion, the question was put, Will the senate reconsider their amendments to the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Mary Gwinn, of Frederick county? Determined in the negative.

The following message was read and agreed to.
