The resolution relative to John Gale's funeral was read the second time by especial order, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The president laid before the senate a letter from the governor relative to his salary; which was read, and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act to lay out and make public a road in Queen-Anne's county, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. After the word "road" in the 11th line of the 1st page insert "not exceeding thirty feet in width, at the expense of the persons willing to contribute, or who may conceive themselves interested in opening and straightening said road." 2. After the word "road" in the 2d line from the bottom of the 1st page insert "when completed and made fit for the reception of the county as a public road." 3. After the word "consent" in the 7th line of the 2d page insert "and provided also, that the said commissioners shall not proceed to open and clear said road before the damages, if any, be paid, or secured to be paid, to the person or persons in whose favour such damages may be adjudged." 4. Strike out the 2d enacting clause.

The bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a road in Frederick county, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. At the end of the bill add "And be it enacted, That the said road, when laid out, opened and returned to the clerk of Frederick county court as aforesaid, shall not be deemed to be a public road to be kept in repair at the expense of the county, unless the said road shall have been opened, cleared, improved, and made a good and sufficient road, of a proper width, and so certified to be by the commissioners aforesaid, or a majority of them."
