

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act to incorporate a company or erecting a bridge over Chester river, a bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a road in Prince-George's county and part in Montgomery county, severally passed by that house December 14, 1808, and the following resolutions:

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, December 14, 1808.

RESOLVED unanimously, That the executive of the state be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to purchase of the United States, for the use of the state of Maryland, four thousand stand of arms, of Whitney's manufacture, at the price of ten dollars per stand, to be paid out of any unappropriated money in the treasury of the western shore, and the executive are hereby authorised to draw on the treasury for the same.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to William Keough, or his order, late a soldier in the revolutionary war, of the Maryland line, a sum of money annually, in half yearly payments, equal to the half pay of a sergeant.

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The president laid before the senate a letter from John Kilty, covering an account of taxes received by him as register of the land-office for the western shore; which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for marking and bounding lands, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. After the word "act" in the 12th line of the 1st page insert "and the supplements thereto."

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Prince-George's county to assess and levy on the assessable property of said county a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, was read the second time by especial order, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. After the word "required" in the 13th line of the bill insert "if in their judgment they shall think it expedient and proper."

The bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Washington county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, the bill, entitled, An act to extend further the powers of the commissioners of Elizabeth-town, in Washington county, the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the corporation of the Roman catholic clergymen, the bill, entitled, An act authorising James Cochran to complete his collection, and the bill, entitled, An act granting leave to the trustees of Lower West Nottingham congregation, in Cecil county, and their successors, to receive a deed or deeds for and hold the lands therein mentioned, were severally read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to establish and confirm certain acts done by persons holding offices of trust or profit under the government of the United States, and the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the county court of Prince-George's county to grant a commission to mark and bound the land therein mentioned, were severally read the second time and will not pass.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for quieting possessions, and securing and confirming the estates of purchasers, was read the second time and will pass.

Whereas it is represented to this general assembly, by the petition of Robert Couden Stone, on behalf of himself, Eliza Causin, Anne Stone and Thomas Stone, children of John H. Stone, Esquire, late deceased, that the said John H. Stone has paid into the treasury of the western shore the sum of thirteen hundred and sixty pounds and two-pence halfpenny, for proclamation land warrants obtained under an act of assembly passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety five, chapter eighty-eight; and that by the operation of an act of assembly passed at November session, eighteen hundred and four, chapter seventy five, all the lands
