**T**HE senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read. Mr. Gibson appeared in the senate.

The bill, entitled, An act to make a further provision for the erection of a new court-house for Baltimore county, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. After the word "in" in the 7th line of the 1st page insert "four." 2. Strike out the word "equal" in the 7th line of the 1st page. 3. Strike out the word "ten" in the 8th line of the 1st page and insert "forty." 4. Strike out the word "shall" in the 1st line of the 2d page.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Francis Rawlings, of Anne-Arundel county, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. Strike out the word "Richard" in the 5th line of the bill and insert "Francis." The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act authorising the drawing of a lottery for the benefit of the College of Medicine of Maryland, and the bill, entitled, An act authorising William Moffitt, late sheriff and collector of Kent county, to complete his collection, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to authorise certain commissioners to lay off a town in Montgomery county, by the name of Brookeville, a bill, entitled, An act for the appointment by the people of the justices of the levy courts in the several counties in this state, severally passed by that house December 17, 1808; a bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the valuation of real and personal property within this state, a bill, entitled, An act for the support of John Richards, of Montgomery county, and a bill, entitled, An act to repeal part of an act to lay out, straighten and confirm, a certain road in Harford county, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and seven, severally passed by that house December 19, 1808; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act to extend the time for the president, managers and company, of the Falls turnpike road to complete the said road, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
