After the word "forfeitures" in the 11th line of the bill insert "And be it enacted, That the said levy court, or a majority of them, shall and they are hereby authorised and empowered, if in their judgment they shall think it most advantageous for the interests of the county, and for the accommodation of the poor of said county, to contract with any person or persons, giving bond with security to the levy court of said county, in such penalty as the said court may require, for the faithful performance of the conditions and obligations thereof." 2. Strike out the word "is" in the 13th line of the bill and insert "are."
