The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of John Cooper, of Anne-Arundel county, and the bill, entitled, An act for the support of William Wheler, of Montgomery county, were severally read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Baltimore county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, and a bill, entitled, An act to fix and establish Argyle alley, in the city of Baltimore, severally passed by that house November 16, 1809; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates returns the bill, entitled, An act authorising John Hunter, late sheriff and collector of Baltimore county, to complete his collection, endorsed, "By the house of delegates, November 16, 1809: Read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment;" which was read, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.
