PRESENT the same members as on Saturday, except Mr. M^r Elderry. The members present adjourn until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

TUESDAY, December 26, 1809.

PRESENT the same members as on yesterday. Mr. Thomas B. Dorsey appeared in the senate. The proceedings from Saturday, inclusive, were read.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Edward Foard, of Cæcil county, and the bill, entitled, An act authorising Joseph M^r Ceney, late sheriff of Anne-Arundel county, to complete his collection, were severally read the second time and will pass.

A petition from Caleb D. Goodwin and Thomas B. Dorsey, of the city of Baltimore, praying a law to give effect and operation to a certain deed of trust from William Goodwin, late of Baltimore county, deceased, to the petitioners, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Partridge, Mr. Lowrey and Mr. Williams, to consider and report thereon.

The bill, entitled, An act to open a road in Frederick county, was read the second time and will pass.

The resolutions disapproving of the resolution of Massachusetts proposing an amendment to the constitution of the United States, and the resolutions approving of the conduct of the general government in the negotiation with the British minister, were severally read the second time and assented to.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

WEDNESDAY, December 27, 1809.

PRESENT the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Thomas, who is indisposed. Mr. Lloyd Dorsey and Mr. M^r Elderry appeared in the senate. Mr. Lowrey was appointed president, pro tem. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion, ORDERED, That the second reading of the resolution in favour of John Smith Brookes, be postponed until Friday next.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

THURSDAY, December 28, 1809.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Thomas and Mr. Glenn appeared in the senate.

The bill, entitled, An act to lay out and make public a road in Baltimore county therein mentioned, the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Edward Foard, of Cæcil county, the bill, entitled, An act authorising Joseph M^r Ceney, late sheriff of Anne-Arundel county, to complete his collection, the bill, entitled, An act to open a road in Frederick county, the resolution in favour of Charles Sewell and James R. Green, of Charles county the resolution relative to the road from Hancock to Cumberland, the resolution in favour of George W. Bradford, the resolutions approving of the conduct of the general government in the negotiation with the British minister, and the resolutions disapproving of the resolution of Massachusetts proposing an amendment to the constitution of the United States, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolutions for the encouragement of domestic manufactures, were read the second time, assented to and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a road from the Little Tonoloway creek, in Washington county, to the Pennsylvania line, a bill, entitled, An act for the appointment by the people of the justices of the levy courts in the several counties of this state, a bill, entitled, An act respecting a monument or statue to the memory of Washington, severally passed by that house December 2, 1809; a bill, entitled, An act to authorise a lottery to raise a sum of money for building a wharf at the town of Cambridge, in Dorchester county, a bill, entitled, An act to empower Jason Moore to sell and convey certain lands therein mentioned, a bill, entitled, An act to erect a town in Montgomery county, and for other purposes and a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes, severally passed by that house December 27, 1809 which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates returns the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the town of Westminster, in Frederick county, through Harman's Gap, to Hagar's-town, Washington county, with the following message:
