The bill, entitled, An act to authorise Thomas Harwood, of Benjamin, late collector of Prince-George's county, to complete his collection, was read the second time by especial order and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to regulate the market-house in the town of William's Port, in Washington county, was read the second time by especial order and will pass.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, An act to regulate the market-house in the town of William's Port, in Washington county, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising Thomas Taylor, late sheriff of Cecil county, to complete his collection, the bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the destruction of wolves in Allegany county, the bill, entitled, An act authorising the sale of a lot, piece or parcel of ground, lately possessed by Jeffrey Dillon Shanley in the city of Baltimore, and the bill, entitled, An act to lay out and straighten a road in Baltimore county, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, were severally read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising James Cochran to complete his collection, and the bill, entitled, An act concerning the register of wills of Saint-Mary's county, were severally read the second time by especial order and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from near Ellicott's lower mills in George-town, in the district of Columbia, was read the second time by especial order, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. After the word "road" in the 14th line of the 37th page insert "And be it enacted, That no toll-gate shall be erected within the distance of five miles of the District of Columbia, nor within the distance of two miles from the Baltimore and Frederick-town turnpike road."

The bill, entitled, An act providing for the payment of the cost which accrued upon the trial of John Free, of Prince-George's county, at September term, one thousand eight hundred and six, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates returns the bill, entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments, with the following message:

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, December 30, 1809.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

WE have agreed to the second amendment proposed by you to the bill, entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments, and have rejected the one respecting the offence of tarring and feathering, which we conceive a crime properly cognizable by this system, and have therefore sent back the bill in expectation that your house, on reconsideration, will recede from the same.
