

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes, was read the second time; passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. At the end of the bill add, "And be it enacted, That should the stockholders aforesaid agree to the extension of said road, that then and in that case the president and managers of said company shall not be compelled to stone and gravel said road more than eighteen feet in width."

The clerk of the house of delegates returns the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from near Ellicott's lower mills to George-town, in the district of Columbia, with the following message:

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, January 1, 1810.

*Gentlemen of the Senate,*

WE have disagreed to the amendment proposed by your house to the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from near Ellicott's lower mills towards George-town, in the district of Columbia, so far as respects the not erecting a gate within the distance of five miles of the district of Columbia, and hope, upon reconsideration, you will agree that the company may erect a gate at a distance of not less than one mile from the district aforesaid.

Also delivers a bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery for the preservation and distribution of the vaccine matter for the use of the citizens of this state, passed by that house January 1, 1810; which was read the first and second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Also a bill, entitled, An act to tax bank stock, and other monied institutions, for the establishment and support of schools for the education of poor peoples children; a bill, entitled, An act authorising commissioners to make sale of the land of which William Warman Berry died possessed, severally passed by that house December 30, 1809; a bill, entitled, An act authorising James Cochran, collector of the first collection district in Cæcil county, to complete his collection, a bill, entitled, An act to authorise a lottery for repairing the church in the village of Jerusalem, in Washington county, a bill, entitled, An act appointing George W. Jackson trustee, to convey to George Robertson certain lands therein mentioned, a bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Baltimore county to assess and levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of John Boyer, Thomas Fowler, and Isabella Fowler his wife, severally passed by that house January 1, 1810; and the following resolution:

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, December 30, 1809.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby required to pay unto Ninian Pinkney, clerk of the council, sixty dollars, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act respecting writs of habeas corpus, and the bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Caroline county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to appoint commissioners to grade and level the several streets, squares, lanes and alleys, in the precincts of Baltimore, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out the words "ten pounds" in the 2d line of the 6th page and insert "fifty dollars." 2. Strike out the words "ten pounds" in the 5th line of the 8th page and insert "fifty dollars."

On motion, ORDERED That Mr. Fenwick and Mr. M'Elerry be added to the committee on engrossed bills. The following message was read and agreed to.
