**RESOLVED,** That the judges of the respective county courts of this state be and they are hereby requested to view and inspect the books and records of the offices of the clerks of their respective county courts, and that the judges of the orphans courts of the respective counties of this state be and they are hereby requested to view and inspect the books and records of the registers of wills, and that they have free access to the same, with power to swear any deputy-clerk in the office respecting said books and records, and that they, or any two of them, report to the legislature, at their next session, the state, order and condition, of the said books and records, and whether the judicial proceedings upon final judgments and decrees have been regularly recorded, or if omitted, in what year or years such proceedings have been omitted to have been so recorded.
