Gentlemen of the Senate,

WE have appointed Mr. Groome, Mr. Randall, Mr. Eccleston, Mr. Neale and Mr. Wainwright, a committee on the part of this house, to join such gentlemen as may be appointed by you, to form a committee of both houses to compare and examine all bills from time to time during this session, as soon as they shall be severally engrossed.

Which were severally read the first time and the bills and resolutions ordered to lie on the table.
 The bill, entitled, An act to lay out and make public a road in Anne-Arundel county, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out the word "and" in the 5th line of the 1st page. 2. After the word "bond" in the 6th line of the 1st page insert "and open." 3. After the word "county" in the 6th line of the 1st page insert "at the expense of those willing to contribute thereto." 4. After the word "recorded" in the 15th line of the 1st page insert "and when the said road shall be so opened it shall be deemed and considered a public road, and kept in repair as other public roads are in said county." 5. Strike out from the word "and" in the 2d line of the 2d page to the end of the clause, and insert "the same when so assessed shall be paid, or secured to be paid, by the persons interested in opening the said road, to the person or persons entitled to receive the same, before the said road, after it is laid off, shall be opened or cleared." 6. Strike out the 3d enacting clause and insert, "And be it enacted, that if any person or persons over whose land the said road shall pass, or his, her or their guardian or trustee, shall conceive himself, herself or themselves, aggrieved by such valuation or assessment of damages by the said commissioners, it shall be lawful for any justice of the peace, on his, her or their application, to issue a warrant under his hand and seal, directed to the sheriff of the county, commanding him to summon twelve disinterested men, qualified to serve as jurors in the county court, to meet upon the premises on a certain day, of which ten days notice at least shall be given to the party or parties interested, and the said jurors, when so met, and having each first taken an oath before some justice of the peace of said county, that he will, without favour, affection, prejudice or partiality, assess the damages sustained by the person or persons at whose request such inquisition shall be taken, by reason of opening the aforesaid road, through his, her or their land, shall thereupon proceed to assess and value the damages accordingly, taking into consideration the advantages or disadvantages, if any, and such inquisition and valuation shall be final and conclusive between the parties respectively; Provided, that the said road shall not be opened through the buildings, yards, gardens, orchards or meadows, of any person without his, her or their consent." 7. Strike out from the word "be" in the 2d line of the 3d page, to the end of the bill, and insert, "paid by the persons interested in opening and clearing the said road."

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of George Stine, of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and will pass.
