

On motion, the question was put, Will the senate reconsider the bill, entitled, An act to give validity to a deed from Robert Gilla Hampton to William Gilbert? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill being read, the question was put, Will the senate receive the following as amendment thereto? viz. Amendment proposed. At the end of the bill add, "Provided, that the said deed shall be recorded among the land records of Harford county within six months after the passage of this act; and provided also, that no title acquired, or that shall hereafter be acquired, before the recording of said deed, by any person, from the said Robert Gilla Hampton, by deed or other conveyance, shall be in any manner affected or impaired by the passage of this act." Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, Shall this bill pass with the proposed amendment? Resolved in the affirmative, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The president laid before the senate a report of the trustees of the Frederick county academy, enclosing an account of the receipts and expenditures of said academy; which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise Hannah A. Hayes, guardian of the heirs at law of Stephen Hayes, deceased, to convey certain lands therein mentioned lying in Cecil county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to preserve the breed of fish in Baltimore county, a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to authorise a lottery to raise a sum of money for repairing the Protestant Episcopal Church in the city of Annapolis, a bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Abraham Parks, and Eleanor his wife, severally passed by that house November 28, 1810; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. Also returns the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of George Stine, of the city of Baltimore, passed by that house November 28, 1810. Ordered that the said bill be engrossed. And delivers the following message:

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, November 28, 1810.

*Gentlemen of the Senate,*

WE propose, with the concurrence of your house, to proceed this day, at 12 o'clock, to an election of two directors on the part of this state for the Union Bank of Maryland. Mr. Elias Glenn, Mr. James Caldwell and Mr. George A. Hughes, are put in nomination by this house, and Mr. Forwood and Mr. Wharton, are appointed on the part of the house of delegates, to join such gentlemen as may be named by you, for the purpose of examining the ballots; and for regulating said election we have adopted the following resolution:

RESOLVED, That the person or persons having a majority of the ballots of all the attending members of both branches of the legislature, shall be the director or directors of the said bank.

Which was read.

The bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act passed at November session, eighteen hundred and nine, entitled, An act to alter and abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government as require a property qualification in persons to be appointed or holding offices of profit or trust in the state, and in persons elected members of the legislature, or electors of the senate, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to authorise the drawing of a lottery in Frederick-Town, for the purpose of paving Market-street in said town, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The following message was read, agreed to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

By the SENATE, November 28, 1810.

*Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,*

WE have received your message of this day, proposing to proceed to the election of two directors of the Union Bank of Maryland, and do concur therewith; no other persons are put in nomination by this house in addition to those mentioned in your message. Mr. Lloyd Dorsey and Mr. Lowrey, are appointed by this house to join the gentlemen named by you to count the ballots and report thereon.

The bill, entitled, An act to confirm to Lewis Grant Davidson, of the city of Baltimore, the surname of Davidson, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The senate proceeded to the election of two directors, on the part of the state, in the Union Bank of Maryland; the ballot box being prepared, and the ballots deposited therein, the committee appointed by the senate to meet the committee appointed by the house of delegates, retired to the conference room, and after some time returned and reported, that James Caldwell had seventy votes, Elias Glenn forty-seven votes, and George A. Hughes twenty-six votes.

Whereupon it is declared in the senate, that James Caldwell and Elias Glenn, having had a majority of the votes of all the attending members of both branches of the legislature, are duly elected directors on the part of the state in the Union Bank of Maryland.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.
