The bill, entitled, An act to widen and alter the direction of Ten Feet Lane, in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time by especial order and will pass.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Philemon Towson and Sebastian Gross, a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of William Maxwell, of the city of Baltimore, a bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the valuation of real and personal property within this state; a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to empower the trustee herein after named to sell certain lands of the late William O'Bryon, deceased, situate, lying and being, in Queen Anne's county, and for other purposes therein mentioned, a bill, entitled, An act to prevent the erection of booths within two miles of any Methodist camp or quarterly meeting in Worcester, Kent, Allegany, Caroline or Cecil counties, a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the children of Littleton Robins, junior, deceased, of Worcester county, severally passed by that house December 8, 1810. The following resolution:

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, December 8, 1810.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed and required to pay to Samuel Huggins, of Cecil county, late a meritorious soldier in the revolutionary war, or to his order, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private during his life, as a further remuneration to him for those services by which his country has been so essentially benefitted.

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of John Carruthers, of the city of Baltimore, an insolvent debtor, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. Strike out from the word "that" in the 8th line of the second page to the end of the bill, and insert "it shall and may be lawful for Baltimore county court, or any one of the judges thereof, to extend to the said John Carruthers the benefit of the act, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, and of the several supplements thereto, without any proof that the said John Carruthers has given the notice required by the said act and the several supplements thereto."

On motion, ORDERED, That Mr. Tabbs be added to the committee on engrossed bills.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Horatio Clagett, of Charles county, was read the second time and will not pass.

The senate adjourns until Monday morning 9 o'clock.

MONDAY, December 10, 1810.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday, except Mr. Lloyd Dorsey and Mr. Thomas B. Dorsey. The proceedings of Saturday were read. Mr. Fenwick and Mr. Glenn appeared in the senate.

A petition from James Fulton, of the city of Baltimore, praying a special act of insolvency, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Glenn, Mr. Wilkinson and Mr. Tabbs, to consider and report thereon.

The resolutions relative to the settling the western limits between Maryland and Virginia, were read the second time, assented to with the proposed amendments, and with the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of John Carruthers, of the city of Baltimore, an insolvent debtor, and the bill, entitled, An act to widen and alter the direction of Ten Feet Lane, in the city of Baltimore, sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out the word "resolve" in the 4th line of the second resolution and insert "resolution." 2. Strike out the word "resolve" in the 8th line of the second resolution and insert "resolution."

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open the road therein mentioned in Harford county, a bill, entitled, An act to open and make public an alley in the town of Snow Hill, in Worcester county, a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Abraham Fuller, of the city of Baltimore, a bill, entitled, An act to lay out a road in Baltimore county, severally passed by that house December 8, 1810; a bill, entitled, An act for founding an academy at Hagar's town, in Washington county, passed by that house December 10, 1810. And the following resolution:

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, December 8, 1810.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Frederick Green, or order, the sum of three hundred and thirty-six pounds seventeen shillings and six-pence, with interest thereon from the twenty-seventh day of April, eighteen hundred and ten, in full satisfaction of a judgment obtained by the said Frederick Green against the state of Maryland; and also the sum of eleven dollars and seventy-five cents, costs, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.
