

THURSDAY, December 13, 1810.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Whitely appeared in the senate.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate the stockholders of the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore, the bill, entitled, An act for founding an academy at Hagar's-town, in Washington county, and the bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open the road therein mentioned in Harford county, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill, entitled, An act to repeal the twentieth section of an act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road to lead from the cross roads near Richard Caton's lime-kiln, in Baltimore county, nearly in the direction of Jones's Falls, to the city of Baltimore, have a second reading on Friday the twenty-first instant.

The bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the valuation of real and personal property within this state, the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Doctor James Archer, of Claiborne county, in the territory of Mississippi, and the bill, entitled, An act to appoint Thomas Woodfield, of Anne-Arundel county, trustee for the sale of the real estate of Joshua Hall, late of said county, deceased, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Thomas Taylor, and Phæbe his wife, was read the second time, and the question put, Shall this bill pass? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follows:
