WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 1811.

THE house met—Present the same members as on yesterday—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The message relative to the printer to the state was sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. L. Duvall, leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to establish two public seminaries and schools in each county throughout this state, and for other purposes. *Ordered*, That Messrs. L. Duvall, Randall, Parnham, Stevens, Bowles, Mariott and Groome, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from Philip H. Nicklin, of the city of Baltimore, praying that the state may purchase as many copies of Maxcey's edition of the Laws of Maryland, as may be deemed necessary to supply the public officers of this state; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Pechin and T. B. Hall.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from Abraham Fuller, of the city of Baltimore, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Pechin and Randall.

Mr. Evans delivers a petition from Rebecca Candler and John Candler, administrators of William Candler, late sheriff and collector of Montgomery county, praying they may be authorised to complete his collections; which was read and referred to Messrs. Evans, A. Jones and Owens.
