## MONDAY, NOVEMBER 11, 1811.

THE House met.—Present the same members as on Saturday.—The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Messrs. Arnold E. Jones and Henry Long, delegates returned for Somerset county; Messrs. Jas. Summervell, and John C. Herbert delegates returned for Prince George's county, and Mr. John H. Riggs, a delegate returned for Montgomery county appeared, and after qualifying in the mode prescribed by the constitution and form of government, and taking an oath to support the constitution of the United States, took their seats in the house.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of the city of Baltimore, praying that the city commissioners may be directed to cause a survey and plot of the ground lying between Harford street and the end of Wolfe street to be made, and that the said ground may be condemned as a public street; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Pechin and Harryman. Also a petition from Benjamin Williams, of the city of Baltimore, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Pechin and Harryman. And a petition from John and Ralph Hassard, praying for a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson Pechin and Randall.
