pair; the garden in excellent order; the interior of the mansion-house is handsomely furnished; the whole of which evidently shews on the part of his excellency, a judicious application of the public money appropriated by the legislature for that purpose; and exhibits his unremited attention for the preservation of the public property. Your committee, from the examination which they have made, are of opinion that a very small appropriation will be fully sufficient for the ensuing year.
