On motion by Mr. Donaldson, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act for regulating the mode of staying execution, passed at November session 1791. Ordered, That Messrs Donaldson, Ennalls and Sanders be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Harryman delivers a bill entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road in Baltimore county; which was read.

Mr. Thos. Williams delivers a bill entitled, An act to give validity to a deed from George M Cullough and Isabella his wife, to David Strohm. And Mr. Howard delivers a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Nathaniel Wallace, of Allegany county; which were read.

The speaker laid before the house a report from the examinergeneral relative to his tees; which was read. And a communication from the clerk of the court of appeals for the Western Shore, relative to the attendance of the judges; which was read and referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice.

The bill authorising the levy court of Washington county to appoint commissioners to lay off the road therein mentioned; the supplement to the act entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Baltimore county to levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned; and the bill authorising the levy court of Frederick county to appoint commissioners to lay out and open a road therein mentioned, were read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Evans has leave of absence.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to change the place of holding the election in the fifth election district in Baltimore county, and the bill for the benefit of John Smock, of Worcester county, severally endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. A bill entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, An act to confirm the location of the turnpike roads therein mentioned passed at June session eighteen hundred and nine, endorsed, "will pass;" which was read. And the further supplement to the act entitled, An act to confirm a road in Harford and Baltimore counties therein mentioned, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read the first and second time by special order, and the question put, That the house assent to the same? Resolved in the affirmative, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The resolution relative to printing the laws, resolutions and proceedings of the General Assembly was read the second time; and on motion by Mr. Donaidson the question was put, That the following be added to the said resolution, to wit: "which said index shall be made by such person or persons whom the governor and council may think proper to employ from time to time for that purpose, who shall be paid such reasonable compensation
