ary war as a lieutenant; they therefore submit the following resolution:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay annually, in quarterly payments, unto Thomas Rowse, late a lieutenant in the Maryland line of the revolutionary war, or to his order, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a lieutenant, as a further reward for those services rendered his country during the American war.

Which was read the first and second time by special order; the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate.

The bill to authorise the levy court of Cecil county to open a road from the Presbyterian meeting house, in West Nottingham, to Creswell's ferry; and the bill for the benefit of Thomas Miller, of Anne-Arundel county, were read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr Hebert delivers a bill entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Prince George's county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Smoot delivers a bill entitled, An act to pay the civil list, and other expenses of civil government; which was read.

On motion by Mr. Donaldson the question was put, That leave be given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to repeal the second section of an act entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, An act relating to negroes, and to repeal the acts of Assembly therein mentioned, passed at November session 1810.
