

Mr. T. Jones delivers a bill entitled, A further additional supplement to an act entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes; which was read.

The bill annulling the marriage of Peter Rouck and Mary his wife, of Washington county, was read the second time and will not pass.

Mr. Randall delivers a petition from William K. Galloway, of the city of Baltimore, praying that the heirs of Aquila Galloway, deceased, may have their title confirmed to a tract of land called "Sewell;" which was read and referred to Messrs. Randall, Harryman and Swearingen.

Mr. Harryman delivers a memorial from the president and managers of the Baltimore and Reister's-town turpike company, counter to a bill for the removal of their lower gate; which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion by Mr. Randall, *Ordered*, That the bill to compel the president and directors of the Reister's-town turpike to move their lower gate up to the intersection of the Liberty Town road have a second reading on the 6th day of December next.

Mr. Randall delivers a petition from Susanna Steward, of Baltimore county, praying a divorce; which was read and referred to Messrs. Randall, Harryman and Long.

Mr. Emory delivers a return from the clerk of Queen Anne's county, relative to the attendance of the judges; which was read and referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. A. Dorsey delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Anne-Arundel county, praying that Quynn's ferry may be the only public ferry in the county; which was read and referred to Messrs. A. Dorsey, L. Duvall, Mariott and Herbert.

Mr. Parnham delivers a petition from the vestry of Durham Parish, in Charles county, praying for a lottery for the benefit thereof; which was read and referred to Messrs. Parnham, Stonestreet and Rogerson.

The bill annulling the marriage of Elizabeth Taylor, of Caroline county, was read the second time, and will not pass.

Mr. C. Dorsey delivers a petition from Alexander Dent, of Charles county, praying to be remunerated for the loss of negro Stephen, who was pursued and shot while a runaway; which was read and referred to Messrs. C. Dorsey, Rogerson and Parnham.

Mr. Stevens delivers a return from the clerk of Talbot county, relative to the attendance of the judges; which was read and referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice.

On motion by Mr. Ennalls leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to authorise any debtor and his creditor to enter up judgment before the clerk of any county within this state where the debtor shall reside, during the recess of the county court. *Ordered*, that Messrs. Ennalls, Tillotson and Smoot be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.
