Which was read.

Mr. Harryman delivers a petition from George Fitzhugh, of Baltimore county, praying to be compensated for the loss of negro Bowce; who made his escape from prison, where he was committed for stabbing his overseer; which was read and referred to Messrs. Harryman, Herbert, Swearingen Callis and Randall.

The further supplement to the act entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Waller delivers a petition from Charlotte H. Rownd, praying for the sale of the real estate of her late father; which was read and referred to Messrs. Waller, Long and A. E. Jones.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from Philip R. L. Friese, proprietor of the Baltimore glass manufactory, praying that persons engaged therein may be exempt from militia duty; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Harryman and A. Dorsey.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to repeal the fourth and fifth sections of an act entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, "An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco, endorsed, "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed. And the resolution relative to Kilty's reports of the English statutes, endorsed, "assented to."

Mr. A. Dorsey delivers a bill entitled, An act authorising commissioners to open the old road leading from Richard Owings' mill, in Anne-Arundel county, to Elk Ridge church, in Queen Caroline parish; which was read the first and second time by special order and passed.

The report on the petition of Henry Reading, was read the second time, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

On motion by Mr. Evans the question was put, That leave be given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to alter, change and abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government which relate to the time and manner of electing the senate of this state, and the mode of filling up vacancies in that body.
