THE Committee to whom was referred the petition of Peregrine Fitzhugh, report, That they have considered the same, and are satisfied from the documents attending it, that the petitioner was a captain in colonel Baily's regiment of horse; in which station he continued until the end of the war; and that he now labors under many infirmities, being upwards of fifty years of age, and is rendered unable to support his family, being deprived of his eye sight. With this view of his case, your committee are under the impression that it becomes the special duty of a dignified state to provide for, and cherish the unfortunate soldier who spent the prime of his life in fighting the battles of his country, and defending her liberties; and recommend the following resolution:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed and required to pay to Peregrine Fitzhugh, late an officer in the revolutionary war, belonging to Colonel Baily's regiment, or to his order, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a captain, as a provision to him in his indigent situation and advanced life; and as further remuneration to him for those services by which his country has been so essen-

tially benefited. All which is submitted.
