Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from the trustees of the free male-school in the city of Baltimore, praying a donation; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Frisby and Pechin. And a petition from the Baltimore Humane Carpenters' Society, praying for a lottery; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Harryman and Randall.

Mr. Tenant delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Pot-pye neck, in Talbot county, praying for a public road down said neck; which was read and referred to Messrs. Tenant, Dooris and Stevens.

Mr. Moffitt delivers a petition from Isaac Chandlee, guardian to Benjamin Chandlee Kirk, a minor, praying he may be authorised to mortgage the real estatate of Abner Kirk, deceased, for the payment of debts and legacies due by him; which was read and referred to Messrs. Moffitt, T. Williamson and Veazey. And a petition from William M'Grath, praying that his title to certain real property may be confirmed; which was read and referred to Messrs. M. ffitt, Groome and T. Williams.

Mr. Donaldson delivers petitions for and against the extension of Pratt street; which were read and referred to the committee appointed to report on that subject.

Mr. A. Dorsey delivers a petition from Rebecca Shipley, of Anne-Arundel county, praying to be supported by said county; which was read and referred to Messrs. A. Dorsey, Belt and Marriott.

On motion, by Mr. Groome, *Ordered*, That this house will, on to morrow, proceed to the appointment of a director to the bank of Baltimore on behalf of this state, for the ensuing year. Mr. Tomlinson delivers a petition from George P. Hincle, of Allegany county, praying to be allowed the improvements on his certificate of survey, which were placed thereon by him, under an impression that his title thereto was fully sufficient; which was read and referred to Messrs. Tomlinson, Blair and Cesap.

The bill to confirm the title of the heirs of Aquila Galloway, deceased, to the part of a tract of land therein mentioned; was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Donaldson, *Ordered*, That the committee appointed to bring in a bill relative to vagrants in the city of Baltimore, be discharged.

On motion by Mr. Donaldson, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, A further additional supplement to the act entitled, An act to erect Baltimore town in Baltimore county into a city and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof. *Ordered*, That Messrs. Don-
