

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 30, 1811.

THE House met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill for the relief of Andrew Dewees and John Miles, of the city of Baltimore; and the resolutions in favor of Pergrine Fitzhugh, John J. Jacob, Gassaway Watkins, Sarah Easton and Dorothy Storer; and the resolution relative to an exchange of laws, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Henry Neale, a delegate returned for St. Mary's county, appeared; and after qualifying in the mode prescribed by the constitution and form of government, and taking an oath to support the constitution of the United States, took his seat in the house.

Mr. Street delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Harford county, praying for a public road from the north end of M'Creary's field, by Thomas Street's to James St. Clair's; which was read and referred to Messrs. Street, Sanders and H. Hall.

Mr. Harryman delivers a petition from the president and directors of the Mechanics' Bank of Baltimore, praying that a law may pass limiting the right of voting by proxy; and declaring what number of practical mechanics or manufacturers shall be elected by the stockholders; which was read and referred to Messrs. Harryman, Donaldson and Randall.

Mr Burgess delivers the following report:

THE Committee to whom was referred the petition of Robert Walters, of Queen Anne's county, beg leave to report, That they have taken the same into consideration, and are of opinion that the prayer of the petitioner is just and reasonable and ought to be granted; they therefore submit the following resolution:

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be and he is hereby directed to receive from Robert Walters, the sum of forty-three pounds ten shillings, being the valuation made under the direction of the executive, of the surplus land included in the said Walters' certificate of re-survey, called "Bourbon;" and that the said treasurer give the said Robert Walters a receipt for the same; upon which it shall be lawful for the register of the land office for the Western Shore, and he is hereby directed, under the direction of the chancellor, to grant a patent to the said Robert Walters on the said certificate called "Bourbon," he paying the fees accruing thereon. All which is submitted.
