

On motion by Mr. Herbert, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, A supplement to an act to make public a road in Prince George's county, passed at November session 1808. *Ordered*, That Messrs. Herbert, F. Hall and Somervell be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Belt delivers a petition from Benjamin Boyd and others, inhabitants of Prince George's and Anne-Arundel counties, praying for a road from the forked roads in Edward Hall's field to said Boyd's mill; thence to intersect the road leading from Annapolis to the city of Washington; which was read and referred to Messrs. Belt, A. Dorsey and Herbert.

On motion of Mr. T. N. Williams, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to empower the levy court of Worcestor county to sell the several ware-houses in said county. *Ordered*, That Messrs. T. N. Williams, Wilson and A. Dorsey be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Brown delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county praying for the removal of the lower gate on the Reister's town turpike; which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Waller delivers a petition from the elders and congregation of the Wicomico Presbyterian church in Somerset county, praying to be incorporated; which was read and referred to Messrs. Waller, Long, and Wilson.

Mr. Willis delivers a petition from John Fisber of Caroline county, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. Willis, Tillotson and Jump.

Mr. Randall delivers a bill entitled, An act for the relief of William Greetham, of the city of Baltimore; which was read.

The bill to authorise and empower the levy court of Prince George's county to assess a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the relief of Edward B. Lowrey, of the city of Baltimore, endorsed "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed. The bill for the relief of the representatives of Henry Charles, late of Dorchester county, deceased, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read, agreed to and the bill ordered to be engrossed. And a letter from the executive inclosing a communication from the governor of New-Jersey, relative to an exchange of laws; which was read.

On motion by Mr. C. Dorsey, *Ordered*, That the bill making an uniform provision for the surviving officers and soldiers of the Maryland line have a second reading on Wednesday next.

On motion by Mr. R. Neale, *Ordered*, That the bill for the amendment of the Law, have a second reading on Wednesday next.

On motion by Mr. Jump, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, A further supplement to an act entitled, An act relating to the public roads in the several counties therein mentioned. *Ordered*,
